Sea of Okhotsk

14 Wakka Site

The site is on the sandbar that separates the Sea of Okhotsk from Lake Saroma. You can enjoy many kinds of plants and flowers bloom in every season to get there.

11 Raitokoro River Estuary site

5 Raitokoro River Right bank Site

3 Tokoro Forest Park of Archaeological Sites

You can look around to find pit-dwelling depressions (more than 100), visit reconstructed pit-dwellings and explore the Tokoro Archaeological Museum.

7 Sakaeura I site

2 Sakaeura II Site (including a part of Sakaeura I Site)

There are over 2000 remaining pit-dwelling depressions that you can explore along the walking path.

9 Tokoro River Estuary site

The excavated items from this site have been designated as a National Important Cultural Properties. You can look out over the site from the western river bank well.

4 Tokoro-Chashi Site

Tokoro-chashi is the ruins of a fortification constructed by the Ainu people. The 11 pit-dwellings of the Okhotsk culture have been found nearby.

10 Tokoro Shell Mound

This ruins of a shell mound from the middle Jomon period is the largest in the eastern Hokkaido area.
